From the Rector's Desk

By the time you read this General Convention 77 will have concluded. In the middle of GC, I became aware of a new ad from Virginia Seminary that said, in so many words, that VTS was "not the left church, not the right church, but the whole church." Yet from reading [Center Aisle](#), the Diocese of Virginia's fine daily GC news broadside, it is clear that the right side of the church is no longer welcome or needed, and their voices will not be heard.

Using the Rev'd John Ohmer's excellent summary of General Convention's proceedings, we see the evidence of that. We (meaning The Episcopal Church – TEC) declined to sign on to the Anglican Covenant, preferring instead to go our own "progressive" way. GC passed a resolution "that will give clergy resources [not] currently found in the BOOK OF COMMON PRAYER or the BOOK OF OCCASIONAL SERVICES for the 'witnessing and blessing of a lifelong covenant in a same-sex relationship.'" Thankfully, the resolution also contains specific language saying that no clergy person must use those materials if it goes against his/her beliefs. Further, although they didn't quite cross the line, they came very close to endorsing "open communion," meaning communion of the unbaptized. What they did authorize was "pastoral sensitivity" in particular circumstances. Personally, I don't need their permission to exercise "pastoral sensitivity."

Ohmer also notes that "CCC: Connections, Corporate Worship, and Communications" are important. Part of what he says is this: "The daily corporate worship brings in all kinds of diversity in language and style." In the face of research that says one of the things that draws people to an Episcopal congregation is the beauty of the liturgy found in the BOOK OF COMMON PRAYER, liturgy that can be learned by heart, words that become comfortable, why is there a need to constantly strive for innovation in liturgy? I confess that at the last several Diocesan services I've been to I have felt like a visitor. We generally don't use the NEW ZEALAND PRAYER BOOK or ENRICHING OUR WORSHIP at St. Peter's, and those liturgies are strange and unfamiliar, at least to me. I can't remember ever – not once – going to a Diocesan service that used Rite I. At St. Peter's, we don't even use the "contemporary" Lord's Prayer, although we might do that later on this season. Even the Prayer Book liturgy now seems to be "modifiable" at will; instead of "Blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever" it's common to hear "Blessed be God's kingdom, now and for ever." I must have missed the class in seminary that said you could change the words to suit your own sensibilities.

But I am heartened by the Very Rev'd Dr. David Cox's "Guest Opinion" in [Center Aisle](#) #8. David is in Lexington, I believe, and was a delegate to GC from Southwestern Virginia. He was also the interim at Emmanuel Church, Brook Hill, Richmond after the Rev'd Dr. E. Allen Coffey and I left. I want to end by quoting him at length, since it is my hope to end on a more positive note than I began. Here's what he says:

This General Convention has conscientiously sought to include a diversity of persons. We have elected women, LGBT, racial and other minority candidates ... We have made motions and passed resolutions seeking to deepen this diversity throughout our church. As well we should.

But has a different diversity been neglected – a diversity of perspective? In Tuesday's House of Deputies motion to ensure diversity on the structure Task Force ... no mention was made of the variety of experiences and outlooks on which the Task Force all will depend: of large parish/medium parish/small parish or diocese; of province or region; of clergy and laity; of Anglo-Catholic/Evangelical/Liberal; of conservative/progressive/in-between; of urban/suburban/town/rural ...

It may be a diversity which is less obvious, but [is] no less needed, if our Church and its councils will truly be diverse – and effective.

I hope our Church – and our Diocese – is listening.

Wardens' Corner

As St. Peter's Webmaster, I represented our church at a communications conference presented by our Diocese. I found it very informative and filled with ideas for making our website more robust. However, the most important take-away from this for me was that we needed to form a communications team with the goal of assuring clear and coherent messaging within our church family. In an era of electronic and instantaneous communications, I realized that we needed to upgrade some of our messaging techniques and strategies.

In 2011, we formed a communications team. Currently, that team consists of our Rector, Parish Administrator/ THE KEYS Editor, Webmaster, E-mail Coordinator, and former THE KEYS Co-editor. We meet quarterly to discuss strategies and tactics for improving our church communications. To achieve this goal we implemented a number of improvements in our messaging techniques.

We implemented an e-mail management tool that has resulted in a consistent look and feel for all of our e-mails, allowing you to subscribe by adding yourself to our e-mail list. Additionally, we created a weekly e-mail called, THE WEEKLY E-PISTLE, which keeps us updated on the more recent events and news of the parish. We went "green" with our monthly newsletter, THE KEYS, and made it available online, dramatically reducing production costs. We also reduced its frequency from monthly to bi-monthly. If you are not receiving these publications or e-mails, please go to our website homepage (www.stpetersnewkent.org) and add yourself to our e-mail list by clicking on "Join Our Email List" and following the directions.

We added an online donation feature to our website which allows you to make one-time or recurring contributions to St. Peter's using your debit/credit card. Fr. Paul has also recently started an online Blog to share his thoughts on various topics. You can find a link to this as well on our website homepage.

It is important that as a parish family we are informed and share information. These improvements will provide parishioners with a more complete and concise summary of parish activities than ever before.

Our communications team is always open to suggestions, so please contact any member of our communications team or Vestry with your comments or suggestions. Please let us know how we can do a better job of keeping you informed.

With the loss of Sarah Lindsey Gupta last November, we all lost a very special and gifted person that touched the lives of everyone that knew and loved her. Sarah was very special to St. Peter's and to me. From the time we met in kindergarten until we both graduated from William and Mary, Sarah was always there offering encouragement and an infectious smile that will never be forgotten.

Sarah knew from a young age that she wanted to be a teacher and went on to obtain her teaching degree from William and Mary. Throughout her teaching career that began in our New Kent County schools, she was beloved by her students and treated each of them as her own. After she was diagnosed with adrenal cancer in April 2010, Sarah remained in great spirits and continued to teach until she became too sick to make it through the day.

To celebrate Sarah's memory, I am organizing the first annual ***Sarah's Memorial Golf Tournament*** to raise money to donate to the Sarah Lindsey Gupta Memorial Scholarship Fund that has been established at the College of William and Mary. 


