From the Interim Rector's Desk

By now the new Vestry has been sworn in and working diligently on the plans for the parking lot and the handicap accessible walkway among a host of other things to keep our parish running smoothly for this year and years to come. I commend them for their commitment to do what is best for St. Peter's and it is a joy to work with them.

Ash Wednesday is March 6 this year and there will be two services, noon and 7 pm. I encourage you to attend one of these as we begin Lent or visit a church close to where you work.

We haven't done it in a while, so I'm thinking of holding two midweek gatherings during Lent. One on March 20 and the other on April 3. A light meal of soup and bread followed by a presentation and then closing with Compline. So I need your help to see if there is any interest in it, and what times suit you best – 6 to 7:30 pm, 6:30 to 8 pm, or earlier even.

Some of the topics for the evening could be: Contemplative Practices of Prayer — what is it, how to do it, and it's health benefits; Bible Birding — birds of the Bible, their uses and symbolism along with a Bible quiz to test your knowledge; The Will of God — presentation based on the book which offers a clear and easy model for understanding what it is, and why; or something else entirely? Give me some ideas of what peaks your interest and we can develop it.

Of course there will be a meal and that means I will be seeking volunteers to make the soup, others to serve, and others to clean up. Since it's Lent, it means we can go very simple and enjoy a common meal and the fellowship and teaching. We would have something for the younger children as well. Let me know if gathering during Lent appeals, and what time and topic suits you. You'll be hearing more about this and other things to do for your Lenten discipline during February so you will be ready for Ash Wednesday and Lent!

At our Diocesan Convention in November, Bishop Goff said she would have a series of listening sessions to hear from the members of the diocese on our concerns/issues and especially plans for the future. In the time following, the Standing Committee dismissed the search for a provisional bishop and has appointed Bishop Goff to be our bishop in this meantime as we seek to hear what God wants for our diocese. She will have hosted several Community Listening Sessions around the Diocese in this season of Epiphany. Each session includes a time for us and our Bishops to share our dreams for our Diocese. The session scheduled for our area is Saturday, February 16, 5-7 pm at the [Roslyn Retreat Center](#).

I forward to hearing from you about plans for Lent and the plans that the Vestry proposes for the parking lot and walkway. Continue to hold the Discernment Committee in your prayers as we all pray their prayer in seeking our new Rector.

We Salute Our Veterans – Colonel George Lydal

George Lydal was born in Middlesex, England in 1634, the fifth son of Sir Thomas Lydal (Little) and, accordingly, had no inheritance from his family in England. Several in the family came to New Kent County and St. Peter's Parish with other relatives and friends to settle in Virginia about 1654, thus escaping, as did many British Royalists, persecution during Cromwell's Commonwealth.

Members of the prominent Bacon family were in that same emigration and established homes in close proximity to the Lydals along the Pamunkey River in St. Peter's Parish of New Kent County. "Here was a regular network of relatives — Cavaliers — who settled at this time in Virginia," and George's daughter would marry a Bacon.

A Land Patent in New Kent County, Virginia, dated 1654, for 2390 acres in New Kent County along Black Creek, and on 12 October 1662, a patent of an additional 3306 acres along both sides of Black Creek, New Kent County was granted to Lieutenant Colonel George Lydal.

Lydal was a commissioned officer, a Captain in the British Army, when he arrived in the Colonies and settled in the New Kent County area. It appears that he may have resigned his commission and taken another in the Virginia Militia, since the historical records show that in 1676, Major George Lydal was appointed to command the fort at Indiantown, Fort Mattapony, under the supervision of Lieutenant-Colonel William Claiborne, of King William County. This was during the time of Bacon's Rebellion, and faithfulness to the Crown (of England) was very much in question.

George Lydal died in January 1705. No records exist of his continued service in the Virginia Militia; however, it is clear that he continued to serve his community until his death and was recognized for his service.

We give thanks for the life of George Lydal, the earliest member of St. Peter's Parish who has recorded military service that is recognized in our church cemetery.


