From the Rector's Desk

Now that both Mother's Day and Father's Day are behind us this year, and now that my mother has been with us a few weeks, I've been thinking a bit about the lessons our parents taught us, both good and bad. No parent, no matter how good, is perfect; no parent, however bad, is irredeemable, although there may be some exceptions to that last one. All parents, and all who have been parents to us, have something to teach us. So I've been contemplating the question, "What might be the most important lesson my parents taught me?" And I think the answer is this:

Actions have consequences.

That's it. Simple, I know, and memorable. But it contains truth beyond measure. Everything I do, whether good or bad, has a consequence. If I drive within the speed limit, avoid accidents, and have a good driving record, my insurance rate goes down. If I have accidents that are my own fault, drive while intoxicated, drive at a high rate of speed and accumulate a stack of driving infractions, my insurance rates go up.

Sometimes the consequences are clearly stated. "Your curfew is midnight. If you are not home by then, you will be grounded for a week for each hour you are out past midnight. If what you are involved in is worth being grounded, stay out; if not, be home on time." No discussion, no appeal, and only once was I able to plead mitigating circumstances! On the other hand, I might be able to drive for twenty years without wearing a seat belt and suffer no ill effect. But one day ...

Actions have consequences.

The ongoing catastrophe in the Gulf of Mexico is teaching BP – and by extension, us – this lesson. If you do this, whatever "this" is, then this, the consequence, will happen. Most of us had never heard of a blowout preventer before two months ago. Now we know that some of them can be five stories tall, weigh 250 tons, and cost \$35 million or more. But if you cut corners, if you skip safety tests, if you don't pay attention, then accidents will happen. Of course, you can do everything correctly and things may still go wrong. But consistently paying attention to the details – the action – leads to increased possibility of safe operation – the consequence.

How does that apply to us at St. Peter's Parish Church? Let's take a typical Sunday morning. A new family shows up for their very first time with us. Let's say they are the "standard" family: mom, dad, two children, and a dog. (They left the dog at home, though.) Mom and dad, along with six-year-old Alex, attend Services, while Alexandra, age 2, goes to the nursery. No one speaks to them, no one exchanges the peace, and when they stay afterwards for lemonade, no one welcomes them. The conversations they listen to are all about people they don't know. They return to pick up Alexandra and find her alone in the nursery with no one around. That family will never return to St. Peter's.

Actions have consequences.

The next Sunday, a different family shows up. A Vestry greeter and a sidesman both meet them at the door. One of them shows them where the nursery and the restrooms are. The other gives them a program, welcomes them, and ushers them in. They sit next to an "established" St. Peter's person who gives them a friendly smile, but allows them to kneel in prayer, preparing themselves for the Service. When the peace is exchanged, names are as well. When time for communion comes, the person sitting near them on their pew helps escort them to and from the rail. After church they are introduced to the Rector and to lots of other St. Peter's folks. The Vestry greeter helps them fill out a visitor card. They go to the nursery to retrieve their offspring and are greeted by the nursery workers, who also chat with them for a bit. The child says what a fun time he's had that morning. That family will probably return to St. Peter's.

Actions have consequences.

We've done pretty well in the "people" category, if the stories people tell me are any indication. But when we look around, we've not done so well in the physical area. Our Building & Grounds folks have done a great job with limited

resources. St. Peter's Foundation has been very helpful and supportive. We would not have our new septic system without them. Likewise, the Restoration Association has helped with many repairs to the church building itself, things like refinishing windows, painting, and refinishing floors. But many of the invisible systems reached the end of their useful life years ago, and no provision has been made for their replacement. Other things we can see, like roofs and pavement, have deteriorated, and again, no provision has been made for their replacement. The Vestry has discussed for several years the possibility of a "sinking fund" for capital replacement, but the funds have simply not been available. We have had a balanced budget, but it has often been balanced at the expense of maintenance, especially maintenance of "invisible" things. Now the time has come when those things can no longer be deferred.

Sometime in the next few months, you will be receiving a letter from the Wardens outlining our challenges and their proposed solutions. For some, it will be a surprise. For others, it will be a relief that those issues are finally being addressed. But our actions – not preparing for the future, not planning ahead, not supporting anticipated needs – have had their consequences. We have a chance to address this soon, and I hope you will receive what they have to say with thought and prayer.



(Adopted by the Vestry Feb. 2005)




