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From the Rector's Desk

The 2012 annual Spring Clergy Conference has recently concluded, and I'm back from three days at Shrine Mont. For those of you who haven't yet been to our conference and retreat center at Orkney Springs, please GO! At the end of the road, surrounded by hills, it's a wonderful place to spend a few days. In the fall, it's the Clergy-Spouses-Lay Professionals Retreat. Cynthia's been able to go a few times and that's always good.

This year's format was different. Instead of a keynote speaker, Bishop Johnston spoke Monday evening and Bishop Gulick spoke Tuesday evening, both under the heading of "Bishop's teaching and reflections." Bishop Johnston's teaching was "The six most important things for a church to do," and they were (1) worship, (2) prayer, (3) stewardship, (4) Christian education, (5) evangelism, and (6) outreach. Bishop Gulick spoke from his experiences during the visitations he's been making around the Diocese. He wanted to "lend us his eyes" so we could see what he sees. He always asks folks coming to the Episcopal Church what brought them here. There were seven basic responses: (1) the priest's preaching, (2) the parish is welcoming, (3) they appreciate a church with historical roots, (4) the beauty of the liturgy, (5) they want a diverse/inclusive/non-judging church, (6) they want to live a "significant life," and (7) they want a church that will allow them to exercise their reason.

Tuesday morning was taken up with workshops. I went to the one called "Fighting the Good Fight," otherwise known as conflict resolution. It was led by Karen Salter, who left Hunton & Williams to found "Dispute Resolution and Diversity Services and Training." She's a parishioner of St. Andrew's Church in Richmond. I know this is the third numbered list of this article, but she gave us two "Top Ten" lists – one for creating or prolonging a conflict, and one for resolving conflict. I'll just give you the first one here with directions to the second list later in this piece. It's very interesting!

The top ten tips for creating or prolonging a conflict are: (1) refuse or otherwise quash honest communication whenever possible; (2) ignore the less powerful, especially when they disagree with you; (3) tell others what's wrong with them, their ideas, and their actions; (4) tell others how to fix "their" problem; (5) take a side: early, often, and vigorously; (6) respond to genuine concern with anger, preferably harsh; (7) if that doesn't work, take the "victim" role; (8) take all of the credit – none of the blame; (9) make decisions for others without consulting with them; and finally, (10) tell those who come to you with concerns that you'll get back to them and then don't.

We need to place our whole trust in Him, just as He places his trust in us, knowing that He will guide us down the right path. This requires a high degree of faith. Worshiping collectively each week as one body can help strengthen this faith.

It seems that our family pets are the most innocent of us all. Their faith and trust in us is unflappable and remains constant throughout their lives. On the other hand, our faith has to be nurtured and reinforced at all times. But I think this is a good thing, since it continually grounds us in the realization of our mortality and the promise of attaining everlasting life.

Thanks to our beloved Eve for reminding us of this.
