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From the Rector's Desk

What an absolutely amazing day was September 16! Our new Bishop Suffragan came to visit us, for one thing. We were only the seventh visitation for The Right Rev'd Susan Goff, who was consecrated July 28 this year. I don't know where she was for the first six, but I'd be willing to bet that for a church our size, we had the largest group to confirm, receive, or baptize! Two adults were received, one teen confirmed, and five children (elementary school age and younger) were baptized. About a hundred and sixty people were there for that service, which was also ...

Restoration Sunday! So instead of a festive reception afterwards, also known as "high coffee hour," there was a meal served. Following the Restoration Association's annual report after the Service, we all went out to a delicious meal on the lawn. Many thanks to all who helped set up and serve. Next year a little more help on clean-up might be appreciated.

That's a general problem we sometimes have. Although it's great that you make coffee in the morning, for example, or serve delicious goodies or a great pot-luck supper, someone has to "un-make" it: wash the dishes, clean the silverware, take out the trash, turn it off, clean it up, put it away. We don't want to discourage your good works, but we do want to encourage you to also stay for clean-up ... and we ask others to pitch in as well.

Things are getting back to normal after the summer. Church School, including Adult Christian Education, began September 23. Adults are working their way through the book of *Esther*. Choir practice began September 5 and continues every other Wednesday, 7—8:30 pm, until late Advent. Three weddings (!) are scheduled in the next few weeks: Christina Cobb and Carter Hatley (son of Robert and Kendall Hatley, grandson of Chap and Margie Harrison) on September 29; Randy Douglas (who was received during the Bishop's visit) and Millie Thomas on October 20; then Win Wallace and Emily Anne Evelyn (daughter of Tom and Emily Clay Evelyn, sister of Patrick, Thomas, and Caroline, niece of Chuck and Padgette Evelyn – you get the idea!) on October 27.

On a more personal note, I've begun a two-year continuing education program. It meets Friday night and all day Saturday, one weekend a month, twelve times over two years. It's called "The Leadership Program for Musicians," and their website (www.lpm-va.org) explains it better than I can:

The Leadership Program for Musicians (LPM) is a nationally recognized two-year continuing education program ... designed to greatly increase musical knowledge and skills of all those who lead music in the parish - organists, pianists, cantors and directors of music. Classes in the program are also of interest and value to clergy, choristers, music and worship committee members and other lay persons interested in worship of the Church. ... LPM helps participants become well trained lay ministers, expands their knowledge of the rich variety of music appropriate to liturgy, increases their sense of vocational awareness and supports their commitment to music ministry.

Wardens' Corner

As some of you know, I am an aviation enthusiast and have been a pilot and flight instructor for many years. My wife, Joyce, and I attended the 2012 AirVenture event in Oshkosh, Wisconsin this summer. Each day as we viewed the thousands of airplanes and watched with awe the great air shows, I was reminded of a quote that many of us in the aviation community are familiar with:

Oh! I have slipped the surly bonds of Earth... Put out my hand, and touched the face of God.

This quote is from a poem called "High Flight," that was written by a pilot, John Gillespie Magee, Jr., during WWII. He never lived to see how famous his poem became as he was killed during the war. These two lines from the poem have been quoted many times over the years and Ronald Reagan used them to eulogize the crew of Challenger 7.

Officer Magee knew what it meant to break the bonds of earth and be "up there." He immortalized those feelings in his poem. I sometimes wonder while flying my airplane if I am really closer to God. We pilots know the thrill of lifting yourself into the air and viewing the earth from above. For me, I become detached from all worldly problems. It is very therapeutic and, believe it or not, calming. If my experience can be interpreted as touching the face of God, then I suppose I have achieved it.

Our images of God throughout the ages has been one of Him being "up there" looking down upon us, seeing us as a microcosm of the universe that He created. So, as we break the surly bonds of earth, are we really seeing our world as God sees it? Officer Magee thinks so in the last verse of his poem:

Up, up the long, delirious burning blue I've topped the wind-swept heights with easy grace Where never lark, or ever eagle flew — And, while with silent, lifting mind I've trod The high untrespassed sanctity of space, Put out my hand, and touched the face of God.
