- Philipp von Hitritz's Eagle Scout project, building a walkway to the boiler room, is completed.
- Currently collecting information on the age and lifespan of the HVAC system and roof of the Parish House. The goal is to develop a long term plan for the replacement needs.
- Short-Term Capital Expenditure Assessment: Two of our outdoor units are approaching or past the end of their lives (20 years). I have a quote from Old Mill Mechanical for a complete upgrade of these units including a 10 year warranty for \$16,875. The remainder of the units should have 10+ years left in them. The roofs have been looked at in the last few years and are in good condition. The other potential expenditures would be the parking lot resurfacing and the flooring in Richardson Hall. Neither of these is essential at this time. The parking lot could
- A/C system went down in the church reminding us that this part of the HVAC system was not replaced. Old Mill Mechanical was called for repairs. After a valve replacement and later an electric motor replacement, it was up and running. Another Sunday, the A/C was out once again. Air in the system was the culprit and automatic bleeds were installed so this would not be an issue again.
- Two trees near the church have been removed by L. G. Scott Tree Service.
- Old fuel oil drum has been removed and sold for \$250 (thanks Craigslist!).
- A/C compressor went out in the Mullins Room and was replaced by Old Mill Mechanical. At this time all of the HVAC systems appear to be in working order.
- Ken Rubert noticed excessive moisture coming from the air handler under Richardson Hall. Insulating the exterior of the air handler should repair this problem.
- The heat issues in the church have been resolved, and a programmable thermostat installed.
- Terry Porter installed an access hole in the ceiling of the Parish House foyer which will provide
  easier access to the attic above the Mullins room. He will also be repairing rotten handrails and
  painting the outside trim of the Church School wing.

Steve Peterson, Stewardship Chair, discussed with a representative of the Diocese of Virginia, effective approaches to development and mechanisms for making sure that parishioner needs and expectations are being addressed.

Stewardship discussed ways of obtaining feedback from parishioners on their spiritual needs and expectations. The first step was the recent survey of parishioners to obtain some basic data and views on how well St. Peter's is meeting their spiritual needs. Following the survey, one or more focus groups will be assembled to supplement and expand on the information from the survey. The objective is to increase parishioner ownership of St. Peter's and understanding of how its activities are impacting

Vestry approved a recommendation that an Investment Committee, under Stewardship, be formed to
