From the Rector's Desk

August begins with a bang, as always! Vacation Bible School is in progress and ends August 2. We are experiencing a really good turnout! Remember that volunteers are always needed and always appreciated. The first Sunday of August brings us our annual Parish Picnic, and again this year Boogie and Anna Davis have invited us to their farm on the banks of the Pamunkey River. Services will be at eleven o'clock that day, followed by a picnic. You are invited to bring your watercraft, and the Blessing of the Boats will be after lunch. You'll find more information about the Parish Picnic on page 9 in this issue.

September brings us a wide variety of offerings and opportunities. Sunday, September 8, after the ten o'clock Service, there will be both the last installment of Inquirers Class and an informational meeting about the Daughters of the King. The Inquirers Class meeting will be to answer any last questions and firm up intentions – who is being baptized, who is being confirmed, and who is being received from another tradition – and include a quick run-through of the Liturgy. "The Order of the Daughters of the King," to give it its official name, is a lay order for women in the Episcopal Church. Its objective is to bring women and girls (there is a Junior Division) into a personal relationship with Jesus Christ through his Church. The emblem of the order is a silver cross inscribed "Magnanimiter Crucem Sustine," and at the base of the cross the initials FHS, which stand for the motto of the order, "For His Sake." There is an article by our own Dorrine Douglass, herself a Daughter, on page 7 in this issue.

There will be two Services on September 15. At the ten o'clock hour there will be a Service of Morning Prayer. Then, at three o'clock that afternoon, we will host The Right Reverend Shannon Sherwood Johnston for his Annual Episcopal Visitation. That will be a fun Service, with several folks to be confirmed, received, and yes, baptized, both child and adult! We're having the ten o'clock Service that day because we don't want anyone to show up and find the doors closed, be they visitors who don't know or long-term folks who don't remember! But if you're only going to one Service that day, please come to the three o'clock Service. It's a first-time afternoon visitation for me, and the details of what will follow are still being worked out. Stay tuned! Although the 15th would normally be Restoration Sunday, that has been moved to the 22nd due to Bishop Johnston's visit. Restoration Sunday will be at the ten o'clock hour, and as always, there will be a picnic on the grounds following.

Finally, on the last Sunday of the month, September 29, we will resume our two-Service schedule. The time is unchanged for the eleven o'clock Service, but the early Service will change back to *nine o'clock* for the rest of the year. We moved the early Service to half past eight o'clock so I could lead Adult Christian Education, but Steve von Hitritz will be leading Adult CE this year and we can move the early service back to nine o'clock. That seems to be meeting with great approval, especially from those who drive a good distance to get here that early!

Finally, the Oyster Roast is back on October 12, from four o'clock until six o'clock. Much has changed this year: ticket prices, the menu, the number of tickets available, and the location, among other things. You'll be hearing more about this one later (see page 8). For now, enjoy the last third of your summer!

I am writing to announce our **SECOND ANNUAL Sarah's Memorial** Golf **Tournament** to support a scholarship fund in memory of my dear friend, Sarah Lindsey Gupta, who lost her courageous battle with cancer in 2011 at the age of 31. This year's tournament will be held **September 20** at The Club at Viniterra.

Sarah was born on October 27, 1980, to proud parents Bill and Kathy Lindsey, and grew up in New Kent. I personally met Sarah in kindergarten and we became the best of friends and attended New Kent County public schools, St. Peter's Parish Church, and the College of William and Mary together. Sarah will be remembered by so many as such a loving, caring, and kind person. Her infectious smile and glowing personality will never be forgotten.

From a young age, it was evident that Sarah was a special and gifted person who touched the lives of everyone that knew and loved her. Sarah had an amazing voice and sang in the choir at St. Peter's for a number of years. She also performed in numerous stage productions throughout her high school years and went on to perform at The College of William and Mary, singing with the *Accidentals*, an a cappella group.

Sarah also knew from a young age that she wanted to be a teacher and went on to obtain her teaching degree from William and Mary and teach in New Kent schools. Throughout her teaching career, she was beloved by her students and would treat each and every one of them as her own. After she was diagnosed with adrenal cancer in April 2010, Sarah remained in great spirits throughout her entire sickness. In the spring of 2011, Sarah married the love of her life, Sumit Gupta, and continued her teaching career in Raleigh, North Carolina until she became too sick to make it through the day.

After we lost Sarah, a number of her dear friends established the Sarah Lindsey Gupta Memorial Scholarship Fund at William and Mary in her memory. Once endowed, this scholarship will be given each year to an aspiring teacher or student pursuing a degree in the arts. Organizing the Sarah Lindsey Gupta Memorial Golf Tournament is just a small way for me to thank and remember Sarah for our enduring friendship. I know Sarah would be proud that a scholarship given in her name will help someone pursue their dreams as she did hers.

Last year's **FIRST** golf tournament exceeded all expectations and we were able to fund a significant amount of the endowment requirements. We are hopeful that this years' tournament will be as successful and that we will reach our funding goal.

I hope you can come out and join us on **September 20** for a fun day of golf and fellowship. Even if you don't golf, you can support the event in so many other ways.

Annual Bishop's Visitation and Reception






