From the Rector's Desk

We're about halfway through the summer as of this writing. I hope all of you are enjoying this traditional time of vacations and family get-togethers!

Speaking of which..."Restoration Sunday" is coming up on September 17, the third Sunday in September. In most churches, that Sunday would be known as "Homecoming." So why are we different? Because in the early part of the last century, a group of people got together with the idea of "restoring" St. Peter's. After its extensive damage by our visitors from the North, it was rebuilt in the style of the day, the 1870s and 1880s. These folks wanted it restored to its colonial appearance.

And so it was that in the 1960s this came to fruition partly due to the generosity of the estate of Dick Richardson and the leadership of Chap Harrison and others. Restoration Sunday celebrates that restoration and encourages people to become members of the St. Peter's Restoration Association—currently only \$25 for a lifetime membership—and in that way, continue the Association's current mission of assisting with the maintenance of the church building when requested by the Vestry. So come home for a meal—the "homecoming" part of the day—and celebrate the restoring of St. Peter's.

Also, an Adult Inquirers Class will be offered in September and October at 10 am on Sunday, September 10, 17, and 24, and also on Sunday, October 1. For more information, see page 3 of this newsletter. Please sign up in the foyer of the Parish House. Although it's going to be geared for adults, no one will be turned away.

Speaking of class, a little educational piece here. It may help if you've been hearing bells lately!

Sanctus Bell: A bell rung by a server during the Eucharist to emphasize and call attention to particular moments in the liturgy. The bell may be a small hand bell or set of bells, or a gong rung with a clapper, or the tower bell of the church. The term is based on the practice of ringing the bell three times during the *Sanctus* (Holy, holy, holy Lord). The practice of accompanying the *Sanctus* with bells dates from the fifteenth century. It is also traditionally rung during the institution narrative when the celebrant elevates the elements of bread and wine, especially in parishes with Anglo-catholic piety. Since the practice emphasizes certain elements of the Eucharistic prayer more than others, some prefer to ring the bell only after the conclusion of the Eucharistic prayer, including the Great Amen. Together, Sarah and I attended New Kent County public schools, St. Peter's Parish Church, and the College of William & Mary. We became the best of friends from kindergarten through college, and I will never forget her infectious smile and glowing personality that was so special to me and many others.

In our five short years of conducting this golf tournament, we have made remarkable strides in building the program in Sarah's memory. On the second year, we endowed a \$50,000 scholarship at the College of William & Mary and, since the third year, have been awarding scholarships from the college each year.

Our fifth year was significant—due to your support—we awarded <u>seven</u> scholarships to graduating seniors in New Kent County. Combined with last year's awards, we have now granted 10 scholarships totaling \$13,000 to New Kent County students!

We want to continue to grow the Foundation from your continuing participation in this annual golf tournament as well as the wonderful gifts/donations that we have been so fortunate to receive. We will continue to award the William & Mary scholarship each year, but we also want to expand our scholarship program at the high school level.
