From the Rector's Desk

"If you want to make God laugh, make plans." That's an old saying but true. Life just feels out of control at times. We craft our to-do list for the morrow, but once we arrive at our place of work or business, that list often becomes meaningless. More than once lately I've gone home after having had a very busy day with not a single thing crossed off my list—and in fact, may even have added a couple of items.

So much of our lives feel as though things are not only out of *our* control, they are out of control—period. We are running, running, running all the time. The proliferation of communication devices and platforms should have made things better, but instead has made things worse. Even while writing this today I'm tempted to check whatever message just came in on e-mail or Facebook when I heard that insistent "ding" that tells me something has arrived. I go to YouTube to watch one single video and half an hour later I find myself still there watching another cute puppy video.

Why doesn't life come with a *pause* button?

Well, it does. It's called *Advent*, and by the time you read this, it's probably here. "Advent: The first season of the church year, beginning with the fourth Sunday before Christmas and continuing through the day before Christmas. The name is derived from a Latin word for 'coming.' The season is a time of preparation and expectation for the coming celebration of our Lord's nativity, and for the final coming of Christ 'in power and glory.'"

Advent is the season that tells us to slow down. As Christians we are not only people of the Book, we are people who have read the Book and we know how it turns out in the end. We know Christmas is coming, but Advent is the season that says slow down, get ready, wait with patience. We don't want to arrive at Christmas Eve out of breath, tongue out, panting, having come through Advent at a dead run. A well-trained dog will wait eagerly, expectantly, but patiently when it knows you have a treat in your hand. The biggest treat of all waits for us, so let us wait with patience.

And remember: "no" is a complete sentence. Use it judiciously.



Christmas Offering

It's Not Your Parents' Stewardship

Many of us can point to a person in our lives who may have served as a mentor. Usually we recall someone older whose life lessons could teach us a thing or two. But the Stewardship Commission members at St. Peter's are taking some lessons from a young, vibrant teacher who leads the Diocese of Virginia's Stewardship Mentoring program. *Julie Simonton*, who many of us heard from the pulpit on September 28, serves as the Congregational Development and Stewardship Officer and once a month, serves as St. Peter's mentor on how we rethink giving in our parish.

Dedicated St. Peter's volunteers—Bill O'Keefe-Vestry Liaison, Mark Whidden, Steve Miles, Rod Molina, Karen Lange, May O'Leary, Jon Ackley, Sue Sitterson, Stuart Burnett, Lisa Guthrie, and Fr. Paul—are committed to finding ways that St. Peter's can increasingly change lives—both our own and those in our parish, our community, and beyond. Recognizing that it's sometimes hard for Episcopalians to express our faith, we are taking a deeper look at what we *can* do, what we *want* to do, and how we can achieve the means to accomplish those goals.

Resources are key. Of course, your annual pledge is important. Without your hard-earned dollars, programs stall, operations cease, and the doors close. God guides us to give until it matters—most importantly, give until it matters to you, the giver. If your gift is too insignificant enough to notice, your life doesn't change and you miss sharing what God has bestowed so generously upon you. But what is often even more precious to us than money is our time. Take a deep breath and step away from "busy-ness" to listen to God. Give some thought and prayer to what you care about and what abilities you possess that can make outreach possible—to make a difference in someone's life. We offer a host of programs and commissions at St. Peter's that benefit our worship and parish life, but don't be constrained by what is currently offered. If you see a need or feel a call, step up and help to create a new ministry.

Sometimes a fresh new perspective through young eyes helps us to focus on gratitude and how to fulfill the potential that God has for each of us. We saw it through the video that Zach Quimby used to capture our deep love for St. Peter's and for one another and we see it through selfless gifts of our wealth, work, and wisdom.

Additionally, due to the success of the event, scholarships are also planned for graduating seniors at New Kent High School.



Sarah passed away in November 2011 with a rare form of adrenal cancer. She was a former teacher at the New Kent Middle School for a number of years, an alumnus of the College of William and Mary, and a member of St. Peter's. The initial goal of the endowment was to offer scholarships to students pursuing a degree in education or the arts at William and Mary. According to Patrick Evelyn, who initiated and continues to lead the tournament, "meeting the initial endowment goal at William and Mary in the first two years was far better than I ever anticipated. However, now that we have met this goal, we have an incredible opportunity to really bring this program home with our plans to award scholarships to seniors at New Kent High School." He went on to say, "I knew Sarah had a large influence on the many people that she touched, but this outpouring has truly been such a blessing."

Over 120 golfers participated in the tournament along with 70 hole sponsors, 10 tournament sponsors, and numerous donations and prize offerings. The weather could not have been any better and everyone enjoyed a great day at Viniterra. The food, the fun, the friendly competition, and the prizes were truly the order of the day. So many supporters joined together for this admirable achievement!

Because of these wonderful successes, Patrick and his committee are already planning for next year's tournament to further enhance the scholarship opportunities. According to Patrick, "We could have never had this spectacular accomplishment without the support and generous donations from so many people, businesses, and surely our church. We sincerely thank everyone for their participation and look forward to seeing everyone next year."

Candle Safety

Candles may be pretty to look at but they are a cause of home fires — and home fire deaths. Remember, a candle is an open flame, which means that it can easily ignite anything that can burn.

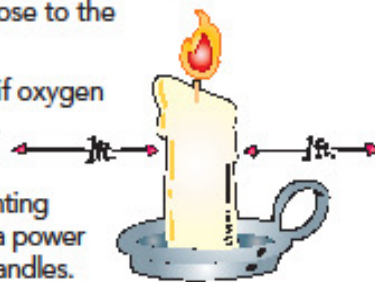
"CANDLE WITH CARE"

- » Blow out all candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Avoid the use of candles in the bedroom and other areas where people may fall asleep.
- » Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that can burn.

Think about using flameless candles in your home. They look and smell like real candles.

IF YOU DO BURN CANDLES, make sure that you...

- » Use candle holders that are sturdy, and won't tip over easily.
- » Put candle holders on a sturdy, uncluttered surface.
- » Light candles carefully. Keep your hair and any loose clothing away from the flame.
- » Don't burn a candle all the way down — put it out before it gets too close to the holder or container.
- » Never use a candle if oxygen is used in the home.
- » Have flashlights and battery-powered lighting ready to use during a power outage. Never use candles.



Candles and Kids

Never leave a child alone in a room with a burning candle. Keep matches and lighters up high and out of children's reach, in a locked cabinet.



FACTS

- ❗ **December** is the peak time of year for home candle fires.
- ❗ Roughly **one-third** of home candle fires started in the bedroom.
- ❗ More than half of all candle fires start when things that can burn are too close to the candle.

Likewise, pre-payments on 2015 pledges received prior to December 31, 2014 can be applied to 2015 pledges, but will be shown on your 2014 statement as a contribution for the 2014 tax year.

Statements will be mailed to you by the end of January 2015.

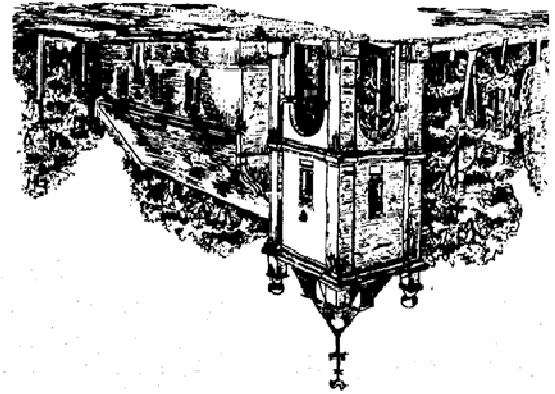
