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From the Rector's Desk 🔲

And now the moment you've all been waiting for. The results of the "service times" survey are in. The result is ... no change. This may be cause for rejoicing for some, or sadness for others, but we want all of you to know that your voices have been heard. This is the first survey I've done, and it's been rather a fun exercise. I've also come to realize how easily one can skew the questions in such a way that the desired results can be obtained, which, considering the reliance some put on polls, is a little frightening.

The reason for the survey was every year when our service times change from summer to winter schedule and then back again, I hear questions about our service times. Why do we have to meet at _____? Why can't we have services at _____ o'clock? A survey seemed the best way to handle it. We publicized it in THE KEYS, in The Weekly E-Pistle, and in service leaflet inserts for a few weeks. We really don't know how many people it went to other than who's on the Constant Contact mailing list, that's about 130 e-mail addresses. That's not 130 people, though; some people have multiple addresses, and some households have only one address. Also, any given computer could only be used once. (Tech-speak: responses had to be from different IP addresses.) We received 75 responses, and that's a pretty high number of participants.

Question 1 was about our "school year" Service times. Currently they are 9 and 11 am. Was your preference for those times, or would you prefer 8 and 10 am? About 75% of you said that you'd prefer to remain at the current times, while 25% said you'd prefer the earlier time slots. That was a pretty clear preference, so the Vestry and I recommend no change.

Question 2 was about our "summer schedule" Service time, currently 10 am. Is that good for you, or would you prefer either 9 or 11 am? Note that 8 am was not an option here! These results were much closer. 52% prefer our current 10 am time, 46% prefer the 9 am time, and 1% prefers the 11 am time. The Vestry and I both felt like in the absence of a clear preference for change that we'd continue in our current time slot. We want to reassure those who voted for 9 am that your voices were heard, but again, without a mandate for change, we opted to continue our present scheduling.

Question 3 was a bit trickier. Several people have asked that we begin a "Public Service of Healing." I'd like to do that about once a quarter for now, until we see how much support that Service gets. I've been here long enough to know by now that most of us really don't like going at any time other than Sunday morning! Of the 75 people who took the survey, 52 answered the question in some way; 23 skipped the question entirely. It's difficult to read a reason for non-response, but I don't take it as a negative. I'm taking it that 23 people simply had no opinion as to the time of the Service.

Of the 52 who responded, 39 said "no preference" or "no preference but … " and then added something. Several said "no preference" but were happy this was going to be an option. Of the remaining dozen or so, no clear trend line emerged. Some representative responses:

- earlier in the month, since many holidays fall at the end of the month
- first Sunday evening of the month

The light of God surrounds you; The love of God enfolds you; The power of God protects you; The presence of God watches over you. Wherever you are, God is!

The presence of God is at work in every area of need for those affected by these disasters and those assisting in the recovery. This is the time for us to focus our blessings on those in need through donations, volunteering time or supplies, and most certainly prayer, so they may rise above these situations with hope and faith.

- last Saturday of the month or 5th Saturdays or any Saturday
- midweek, Wednesday or Thursday, 6:30 pm
- 5th Sundays, maybe combined with a simple supper

So, for the remainder of the year, we'll have them on the Saturday before the 5th Sunday, since each quarter has at least one month with five Sundays. In 2011, that will be July 30 and October 29 at 7 pm in Richardson Hall. I'll be discussing the ramifications of this with Altar Guild Chair Kim McLean, so stay tuned for news from there if you're a member of the Altar Guild.

Finally, if you haven't visited www.stpetersnewkent.org, our website, recently, please do! Webmaster Rod Molina really should be called a web-wizard! It's one of the best-designed, professionally, appearing sites I've seen, and the content changes often. It's a great source for information, upcoming events, introduction to our various programs, and genealogical research. We have also recently added a "Donate Now" button allowing you to make a donation through our webpage. There are a lot of options there: A one-time or recurring donation? To the 2011 general fund, the Book of Remembrance, the Rector's Discretionary Fund, or Endowment (St. Peter's Foundation)? On behalf of, in honor of, or in memory of? And so on. One important thing to remember is that those donations are managed by Network for Good, which grants 97% to us and keeps a 3% fee. At the bottom of that page you can choose to make a \$100 donation, for example, of which \$97 would go to St. Peter's and \$3 to Network for Good (NfG) OR you can opt to "donate for charity" and add 3% to your donation, in which case your donation would be \$103 and St. Peter's would receive \$100, and NfG would receive \$3. NfG is a 501(c)(3) charitable entity, so the entire \$103 is tax-deductible for the donor. This will make more sense once you see it. Check it out!

We're looking forward to Youth Sunday on June 5, the first Sunday of our summer schedule. We'll see you at 10 am that day.

It's Eastertide, so I can say it: Alleluia! Christ is risen! *The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!* Faithfully,


