From the Rector's Desk

Producing a new church directory can be—but does not have to be!—a difficult experience. In our case, it's not going to be, because we're doing it in-house. The Vestry was approached some time ago about the possibility of a new directory. Our last one dates from 2009, and a lot has happened since then. We really didn't want to deal with one of the commercial outfits, and an in-house production sounded like a better choice. So the project was approved: Ann Bradshaw will be doing the photography, and Jayne Thomas Pinelli will be doing the typesetting. Here's how it will work.

The "picture days" will be **May 31, June 7, and June 14**, after the ten o'clock morning service. No appointments are necessary. Just come to the Mullins Room and have your picture taken. If you have any questions or can't be there for any of the "picture days," please contact Ann at (804) 966-1855. You may also e-mail her at ann@saycheez.com—note the three "e's" in cheez! It will be quicker than the "commercial outfits," too, because there will be only one family picture taken. You will be able to **update your personal data** prior to having your picture taken.

Speaking of which ... PLEASE check your data! We make every effort to keep accurate records of our membership, but each time we produce a print directory through ACS, our church management software, we are acutely aware of how fallible we are. For example, people move and forget to let us know, so we have an incorrect address. Or we have mom and dad, but not their children. Or we have the children and not their birth dates. This can be true even if you're long-time parishioners!

Ann is going to provide you with information regarding her website when you have your picture taken. From the website, you can view your photos and select which one you prefer for the directory. Unlike commercial outfits, you won't be getting a "free eight by ten color glossy photograph," but also unlike commercial outfits, you are under no obligation to buy anything and you won't be pressured to do so. If you *want* prints, on the other hand, I'm sure Ann will be happy to oblige!

Finally, let me say a special word of thanks to the Garden Guild. The grounds at St. Peter's have been picture-postcard-perfect in April and May. The weather's been nice (mostly) and the campus looks inviting and green. The new plantings in the Meditation Garden look good, too. Your hard work is appreciated very much!

Worship

A Music Note

What's your favorite hymn? There are several that come to my mind instantly. Hold that thought and read on for the "Rest of the Story."

In the April/May issue of THE KEYS we learned how music plays a part in our worship service. Lyrics about the scripture and Bible stories are written and set to music. Hymns and choral anthems are selected based upon the scripture lessons or the day to be commemorated. Here are some examples of how music played a part in our worship services during the Easter season.

On Good Shepherd Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Easter, the choir sang *The Lord's My Shepherd*. This is a great example of taking a poem or a story, in this case, *Psalms 23*, and setting it to music. The readings, the homily, and all the hymns that day were about the Good Shepherd. They were well loved hymns and easy to sing.

On Ascension Sunday we sang songs about Christ's love for us and his lifting from the earth and ascension to heaven. The first verse of the first hymn, *See the Conqueror Mounts in Triumph*, paints a vivid picture of that ascension.

See the Conqueror mounts in triumph; see the King in royal state, riding on the clouds,
his chariot, to his heavenly palace gate! Hark! The choirs of angel voices joyful alleluias
sing, and the portals high are lifted to receive their heavenly King.

Although the words may not have been familiar, the tune was familiar which helped in the singing.

On Pentecost we sang about the Holy Spirit to commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' disciples, empowering them for their mission. Some refer to Pentecost as the birthday of the church.

On Trinity Sunday, we honor the Holy Trinity—the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We remember the Father as our Creator, the Son as our Savior, and the Holy Spirit as our Comforter. We are reminded that we should respond to God's love by praising Him and giving Him glory. We will sing some favorites including *Come Thou Almighty King*, *Immortal Invisible*, and *Holy, Holy, Holy*. The Children's Choir will praise God's love for each of us in their song.

Now, for the Rest of the Story. This summer I'd like to incorporate some of your favorite hymns into the service, either as pre-service music or during the service. Write down the name of the hymn and give it to me. It doesn't have to come from our hymnal. It could be a hymn you remember from your childhood. We have diverse backgrounds of worship experiences, so it should be interesting. Hopefully you will enjoy this. I know I will. Remember, we don't have music every Sunday in the summer, so please submit your requests early.

The choir does a great job leading our congregational singing. They have the summer off and will start back to work in the fall. That will be a perfect time for new members to join. If you love to sing, there is a place for you in the choir. *Being a music star is not required.* So this summer, when choir members join you in the congregation, sing along with them, chat with them, and then plan to join us in the fall.

I am writing to announce our **4th Annual Sarah's Memorial Golf Tournament** to support a Scholarship Fund in memory of my dear friend, Sarah Lindsey Gupta, who lost her courageous battle with cancer in 2011 at the age of 31. This year's tournament will be held on **September 25** at The Club at Viniterra.

Sarah, Bill and Kathy Lindsey's first daughter, attended New Kent County public schools, St. Peter's Parish Church, and the College of William and Mary. We were the best of friends from kindergarten through college, and I will never forget her infectious smile and glowing personality that was so special to me and so many others.

From a young age, it was evident that Sarah was a special and gifted person who touched the lives of so many who knew and loved her. Sarah had an amazing voice and sang in the choir at St. Peter's for a number of years. She also performed in numerous stage productions throughout her high school years and went on to perform at William and Mary, singing with the *Accidentals*, an a cappella group.

Sarah knew that she wanted to be a teacher and went on to obtain her teaching degree from William and Mary and teach in New Kent schools. Throughout her career, she was beloved by her students and would treat each and every one of them as her own. After she was diagnosed with adrenal cancer in April 2010, Sarah remained in great spirits throughout her entire sickness. In the spring of 2011, Sarah married the love of her life, Sumit Gupta, and continued her teaching career in Raleigh, North Carolina until she became too sick to make it through the day.

After losing Sarah, a number of her dear friends established the Sarah Lindsey Gupta Memorial Scholarship Fund at William and Mary in her memory. Within the first two years, we were able to fully endow this fund and the first scholarship was given to an aspiring teacher at W & M in 2014. Each year, we have been able to grow this program and have now established the scholarship program as a foundation and received a tax exempt status as an established charity. With the achievement of this significant milestone, our future ambitions are to not only continue the scholarships at William and Mary, but to also grow the program to award scholarships to graduating seniors from New Kent High School.

Youth Mission Trip Update

St. Peter's Youth Mission Team will be going to Wake County in Raleigh, North Carolina on our next Youth Mission Trip! We are scheduled to go July 26-31. We have nine high school attendees ranging in ages 14-18, as well as two chaperones. Chaperones this year include Preston Martin, a.k.a. "Mr. Incredible," and Catherine Pierce. After many mission adventures with YouthWorks, we have discovered a smaller Episcopalian youth mission organization recommended by our own Diocese: **Raleigh Youth Mission**. RYM operates two mission locations in North Carolina: Raleigh and Asheville. Raleigh is a large urban city with, unfortunately, a huge homeless population. Our missionaries will be immersed in preparing meals and serving the homeless in shelters, visiting the elderly at an adult day care center, spending the afternoon at a men's addiction shelter, or possibly working in a community garden. We hope to host a small team-building event at the church prior to our trip.

The youth would like to thank Kim Filipowicz and her wonderful team of volunteers for organizing the 14th Annual St. Peter's Annual Golf Tournament as well as the golfers and other supporters of this community event. The tournament was held on Friday, May 8 at Brickshire Golf Club—and a great time was had by all!

Matthews Haven will be hosting our annual Back to School Fair on **Saturday**, August 15. As you will note, it will be held on a Saturday this year instead of Friday, and it is a week earlier than usual. We are hosting an even bigger event this year; it will be a true 'fair' style event! We have joined with the New Kent Department of Health, the New Kent Lions Club, Central Virginia Health Services, Bay Transit, as well as local businesses to offer services to all of the children who will attend our Back to School Fair. In addition to providing **school supplies** at this year's event, Matthew's Haven will provide **vision screenings**, **information on low cost or free dental services**, and **immunizations** for children entering pre-K or kindergarten as well as those entering sixth grade. Also, local hair stylists have offered to provide **vouchers for free haircuts**. Additionally, new **undergarments** will be provided, including socks, underwear, and t-shirts. It is our desire to provide these services to every child who receives free school supplies. This special event will be hosted at St. Peter's. However, all children must be registered in advance through their social or case worker. We will need additional volunteers for this event. If you are able to help that day, please let me or one of the Matthew's Haven volunteers know.

Our beautiful handmade quilt, donated by the New Kent Quilting Bee and machine-pieced and hand-quilted by local quilter Patricia Ankrom, is finally complete. Following countless hours and more than 15 months to complete, the queen size quilt featuring reproduction fabric of the Civil War period will be displayed in the Parish House. Raffle tickets will be sold in the near future and any tickets that were purchased tickets a year ago will be part of this raffle in the fall. Tickets are \$5 each or 5 for \$20. Be on the lookout for updated information about ticket sales in *The Weekly E-Pistle*, both the Matthew's Haven and St. Peter's web sites, as well as upcoming Sunday leaflets.

With the leadership of Lisa Guthrie, we have been working on developing a year round stewardship program with the guidance of Julie Simonton from the Diocese of Virginia. Many of you heard Julie preach one Sunday last fall, and Julie also spoke on wisdom at our Lenten Potluck Supper in March.

Julie said the following prayer to get us started with the Stewardship process:

My Church is composed of people like me. I help make it what it is. It will be friendly, if I am. Its pews will be filled, if I help fill them. It will do great work, if I work. It will make generous gifts to many causes, if I am a generous giver. It will bring other people into its worship and fellowship, if I invite and bring them. It will be a church of loyalty and love, of fearlessness and faith, and a church with a noble spirit, if I, who make it what it is, am filled with these same things. Therefore, with the help of God, I shall dedicate myself to the task of being all the things that I want my church to be. *Amen*


