From the Rector's Desk

A story told to me by a colleague is a good way to introduce this newsletter's column. It seems that a young pastor was speaking to a noonday men's group with about a dozen in attendance. The minister had a project in mind and laid it out in detail. It was a very rousing, inspiring address and ended with a pitch: "And so I need about ten good men to step up and take on this responsibility." Each of the dozen or so men as they left said some variation of this to the cleric: "Great talk, Pastor. I sure hope you find those ten men you're looking for!"

Since the Vestry retreat this year, its emphasis has been on "Invite-Welcome-Connect." It's based on a wonderful program out of the Diocese of Texas. (See www.invitewelcomeconnect.com.) The short version is that it's wonderful to go out and invite people, it's a skill to make them feel welcome once they get here, but once here and properly welcomed, people are more likely to stay if they're connected. So the column this time is about some ways in my portfolio that folks (whether newcomers or long-time communicants) can be more connected and contribute to the life and work of the church.

One way is by becoming a Minister of the Liturgy: Chaliceist, Lector, or Intercessor. A Chaliceist is one who "bears the cup" at communion. We are critically short at the nine o'clock service, having had two recent retirements, and are also a bit short at the eleven o'clock service. We need more help at both. Lectors—those who read the lessons and Psalm(s) for the day—and Intercessors—those who read the Prayers of the People—are also needed. Training is provided, of course. You can also serve in more than one role on a Sunday; some like to be Chaliceist and Lector, others Intercessor and Chaliceist, and so on. I've also been talking with some folks about instituting a Lay Eucharistic Visitor program. That's when a Lay Eucharistic Minister (LEM) takes communion from the church directly to a home or hospital.

Acolytes are also needed. Crucifers, the Acolyte who carries the cross in procession, may be either adults or confirmed youth. Servers attend the altar, receive the offerings and oblations, open and close the chancel gate, and just generally help out in a variety of ways. Torchbearers are those who carry the torches in procession—also known as "candles on a stick," but not to be confused with candlesticks! Finally, Peter's Heralds ring the bell in the tower before (and occasionally after) services. There are guidelines for these, and for more information, please contact Steve Miles at 804-966-9240 or s.miles@suntrust.com.

Finally, a very big *Thank You* to all who participated in the recent "Final Affairs Fair." We had five presenters and almost 50 people in attendance. Lots of good discussion and good questions, and of course, good food from Jeff Fazio, Margaret Best, and Cynthia Rowles.

Also, a reminder that our summer worship schedule begins May 28 with one service at ten o'clock. Youth Sunday is the following Sunday, June 4, and then the summer diaspora begins. In your travels, I hope you will visit other churches and bring back anything interesting—newsletters, worship leaflets, visitor items, and so on. We love to see how other folks do it.

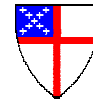
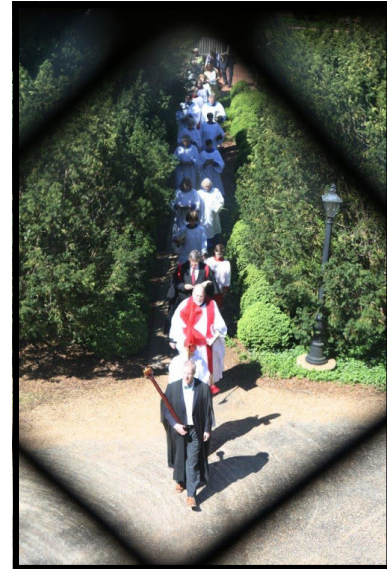
Warden's Corner

Every time that I pass through the brick pillars which mark the entrance of St. Peter's, I am struck by the sense of beauty and history that surrounds this church. As I come down St. Peter's Lane and see the tower come into view, I often wonder how many others have taken in this sight over the years. We are truly blessed to call this special piece of property tucked away in a corner of New Kent our church home. But thanks to the efforts of so many St. Peter's parishioners, the church is more than a beautiful place to worship. Since joining the Vestry last year, I have had the privilege of working with many outreach programs associated with St. Peter's Parish Church. For instance, we sponsor the local Meals on Wheels program which delivers food to shut-ins in New Kent County. St. Peter's is used as the hub to coordinate the delivery of meals, and many of our own parishioners volunteer their time to help make the deliveries. Our youth are also involved in St. Peter's outreach efforts. For the second year, the annual Youth Mission Trip will benefit the Thornwell Home for Children in Clinton, South Carolina. Thornwell provides care for children ranging from toddlers to young adults who are in difficult family situations. It relies on the generosity of others in this mission. If we look a little closer to home, we will see the many St. Peter's volunteers who literally work around the clock to make sure that Matthew's Haven continues its important work of helping families with children in our local community receive the basic necessities of life.

These are only a few ways in which St. Peter's reaches out and takes the mission of the church beyond its borders. I could name many more, but the space allotted will not allow. I do, however, want to thank every person who has helped St. Peter's to further its commitment to community outreach. Until joining the Vestry I did not realize how many of our parishioners were involved doing so. Now when I drive down St Peter's Lane and see that tower come into view, I smile knowing that we are spreading the beauty of our church beyond our little corner of New Kent County.

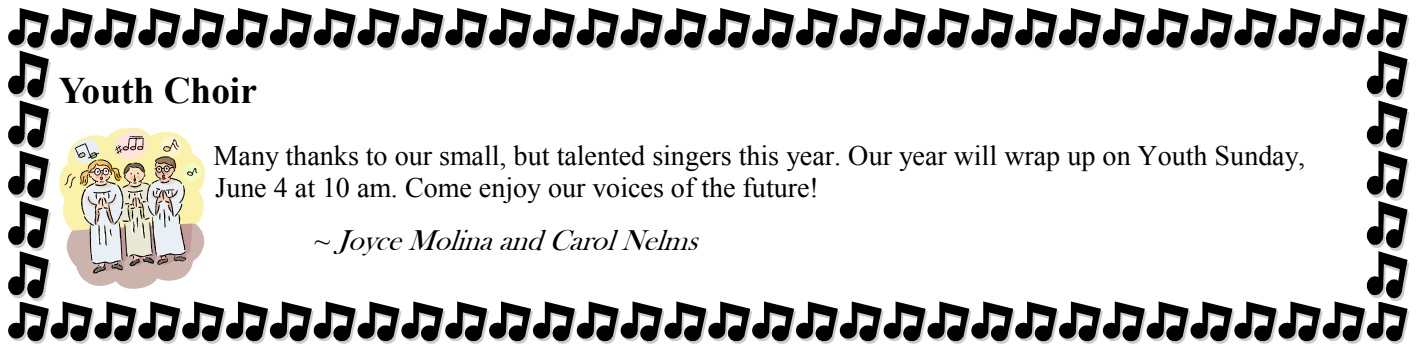
Church School News

Congratulations to Two of St. Peter's Own!

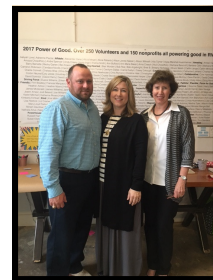
Carrie Evelyn

I have been given the honor of informing you Nancy Goodman, our Adult Services Professional, has been selected as this year's recipient of the Helen J. Napps Award of Excellence!

The Helen J. Napps Award of Excellence, established by the Virginia Coalition for the Prevention of Elder Abuse (VCPEA), recognizes professional excellence by individuals who work in the area of elder abuse prevention and/or elder abuse protection. VCPEA presents the award at its annual abuse prevention conference in Virginia Beach in odd-numbered years.

Nominees have made substantial contributions to the prevention of and/or response to the neglect, abuse, and exploitation of older Virginians. Nominees demonstrate moxie, integrity, attitude, and adaptability in their actions. They may work in adult protective services, domestic violence services, aging services, mental health services, health services, rehabilitation services, law-enforcement, legal services, health care, academia, guardianship, research, volunteerism or any other discipline that participates in elder abuse prevention and/or protection.

Like all of us, the selection committee at the Virginia Coalition for the Prevention of Elder Abuse (VCPEA) agreed that Nancy embodies the spirit of this award. This prestigious award is only presented to the very best professionals from across the entire Commonwealth of Virginia. In total, there have only been nine other award winners over the past 16 years.

Nancy will be presented this award at the annual VCPEA Conference in Virginia Beach on June 1, 2017.

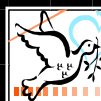

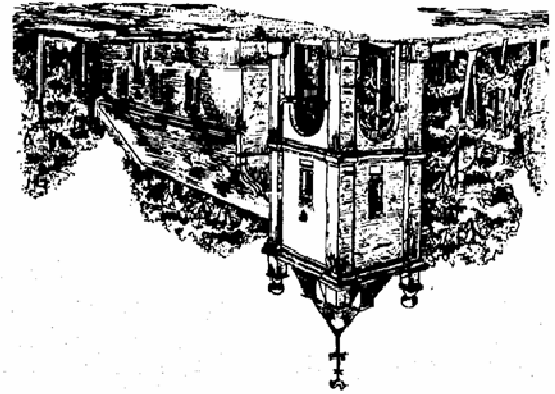
