From the Rector's Desk

COMMUNICATION: Com·mu·ni·ca·tion (/kə, myoonə'kāSH(ə)n/) *noun* (1) the imparting or exchanging of information or news. Direct communication between the two countries will produce greater understanding." (2) means of connection between people or places, in particular. (from GOOGLE DICTIONARY)

Sounds simple enough, doesn't it? "Communication: a process by which information is exchanged between individuals through a common system of symbols, signs, or behavior; [the] exchange of information." (from MERRIAM-WEBSTER)

Yet to tell the truth, communication can be one of the most difficult things we humans do.

Last year we had a "Final Affairs Faire," discussing all sorts of end-of-life issues, everything from attorneys and legal affairs to funeral directors and cemetery managers. One of the things that stood out to me was how little communication (there's that word again) had gone on in families regarding these things. Even the most basic things hadn't been discussed—not just scripture or hymns, communion or not, organ donation or not, but the disposition of the remains: cremation? Burial? Viking ceremony at sea?

Then the May edition of *Vestry Papers* arrived in my inbox. (See <u>www.edfvp.org/vestry-papers</u>.) The theme this month is "Clergy and Lay Transitions," and could not have been more timely. Hope Eakin's article on "Good Transitions" is worth looking up and reading in its entirety, but I will highlight her "Five ways a congregation in transition can prepare for the future." Notice, please, that one of the key themes throughout her article is—you guessed it—communication.

Pray. Listen to God. Listen to each other. You are part of God's word, and part of God's mission.

Be adventurous. Try something new. Assess the outcome-revert to form if the new effort fails.

Regarding the former clergy leader: let him/her go. Focus on the future, not the past.

This transition time is a good time to make any needed changes in personnel or staff structure.

Be there. Don't drift away. The church belongs to you and God-support it.

She also lists "Five ways interim clergy can support a congregation's faith and future":

Love the congregation. Listen to them. Pray for them. Remember: they're staying, you're not.

Be there. They're feeling deserted, so be at as many church events as you can.

Change can be upsetting. Move slowly, and only if necessary. Explain what you're doing and why.

Here's a story she tells to illustrate that one. "In one church, a new priest tossed out the stained and frayed cushion that held the altar book, only to learn that it had been made from the vestments of the beloved founding rector. While he [*sic*] was repentant, the damage was done." Here's where some **communication** would have helped.

Be a cheerleader. Identify and praise the strengths of the parish.

You are there to lead the parish in mission now, not someday. Even in transition, the parish continues to live and grow. Even a small project can have a large impact.

In the introduction to her article, Eakins says,

Change is often threatening. Transitions can be fraught with anxiety and the fear of losing what we love and expect, of what makes us comfortable and lifts our souls to God. Both the congregation losing its priest and the priest who is moving on are often fearful of letting go. But a system that cannot or will not embrace change ... is dead or dying. A system that sees possibility and opportunity in times of change is open to new life and new hope.

What wonderful new things does God have in store for each of us in the months and years ahead?

Save the Date for VBS: SHIPWRECKED - Rescued by Jesus July 30 - August 3

Venture onto an uncharted island where our kids survive and thrive! Anchor kids in truth that Jesus carries them through life's storms. Join our Castaway Crew for an incredible Vacation Bible School week, scheduled for Monday, July 30 through Friday, August 3, from 9 am to 12 noon. All "hands on deck" are needed to help for one day or all week. Any assistance is appreciated on St. Peter's Island!

A sign-up sheet for children who would like to attend VBS and a sheet for volunteers to help will be placed in the Parish House foyer. Volunteers (ADULTS and TEENS) are needed for the following jobs:

***Snack Crew** (5 needed): Volunteers provide and serve snacks for participants for one day, to approximately 40 children and volunteers. Water bottles are provided by the VBS team, so volunteers are only responsible for food.

*Group Leaders (8 needed): Volunteers escort age-level groups to daily activities.

*Imagination Station Leader (1 needed): Volunteer provides leadership and instruction of an organized craft or experiment, which is already planned for you. Assistance is needed to help the children complete the activity.

*Games Leader (1 needed): Volunteer helps facilitate and lead daily organized games, which are already planned for you. Just have fun!

*Video Bible Buddy Leader (1 needed): Volunteer is in charge of playing Bible Buddy video, handing out Bible Buddy tags, and going over a simple two-minute Bible summary of video. All resources are provided for you, so it's easy and the children love getting their Buddy tag.

***Bible Education Leader** (1 needed): Volunteer educates the different age-levels about the daily Bible lessons. All resources are provided; this is such a rewarding position since you experience how much they truly learn about God's word.

*Assistant Helpers (4 needed): Volunteers help with Pre-school classroom, Games, and Imagination Station. They help with whatever needs to be done to help these activities run smoothly, safely, and keep them fun!
