From the Rector's Desk

We've just come through an interesting and varied few weeks here at St. Peter's.

Saturday, August 14, the Burial Office was read for the Rev'd William Thrall Doncaster, Jr., Ph.D. Bill was the father-in-law of Sam Bruce, our Choirmaster and Organist. When Sam came to St. Peter's in the summer of 2003, Bill came with Sam. I, for one, am glad that both Sam and Mr. Bill ended up here. I don't think many people truly appreciated Dr. Doncaster's stature and intellect. Ordained a Presbyterian minister, he served one church for a number of years before moving on to a seminary position which he held until his retirement. He'd been married 40 years at the time of his wife's death. His depth of knowledge was amazing, and his curiosity never-ending. I am grateful for his time among us.

Sunday, August 8, we had our annual Parish Picnic and the Blessing of the Fleet. Our "fleet" consisted of only one vessel this year, thanks to Bruce and Karen Lange for bringing their boat. Anna and Boogie Davis, along with their family, hosted us again, and a wonderful time was had by all. Nice weather in the morning was followed by extremely high heat in the afternoon.

The week before that, August 2-6, was our annual Vacation Bible School, led by Kristin Swynford and Jennifer Ezzell. Again, though it was brutally hot most days, the rains mostly held off and a good time was had by all. I'm told that close to 30 children were registered. The energy level was about twice that! Our teens came and helped out, too, and a big thank you goes to them.

And the week before *that*, July 24-30, was our annual Youth Mission Trip. This year we went to Daytona Beach, Florida. How did we pick Daytona Beach, you ask? Simple: the Rector was too quick to speak and too slow to think. Back in the spring of 2009, Adriane Marshall, our Youth Mission Trip Leader, was discussing with me the possible places they could go this year. Where to go: rural, urban, city, American Indian, small town, or international? The trips ranged from the Adirondack Mountains of New York to the Yakima Reservation in Washington state. Bayou la Batre, Louisiana? Harrisburg, Pennsylvania? The northern Cheyenne reservation in Montana? Daytona Beach, Florida? To which the Rector all-too-quickly said, "If you go to Daytona Beach, I'll go with you." And Adriane, of course, immediately said yes, that's where we'll go. At that point, it was done and I couldn't back out!

Of course, I was thinking more "beach" than "mission," and that was a mistake. Oh, boy, was it ever. In the six days we spent in Daytona Beach, we saw the beach for less than two hours one evening. The rest of the time was absolutely packed and tightly scheduled. Since the YouthWorks! folks don't distribute their materials, I'm having to rely on memory, but it seems that from the moment we rolled out of our comfy air mattresses and sleeping bags at 7 am until lights out at sometime after 11 pm, almost every moment was scheduled: breakfast, clean-up, devotions, prep for job sites, out to the job sites, lunch, switch job sites (we had different sites morning and afternoons), back to the church. Then showers, a tiny bit of free time, supper, clean-up, more devotions, Club, church time (when church groups met separately), then a little bit more free time, then bed. It made for very long days.

Wardens' Corner

I was driving a couple hours from New Kent a few weeks back and saw a church sign that read "Hot enough this week? Try a lifetime in Hell." "Nothing like positive motivation, huh?"

This has been an extremely hot and dry summer. What would we all do without the escapes of air conditioning, boats or a chlorine filled refuge? But speaking of this dry spell -- rain is usually an impediment for many of us, something that gets in the way of our plans. To be sure, rain can surely affect a baseball game, birthday party, wedding reception or outdoor work. However, for those who work with the land, normal rainfall is anything but a hindrance – it is a vital part of the lifeblood of agriculture. We recognize this fact in Form I of the PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE, which we use on some Sundays, when we pray "For seasonable weather, and for an abundance of the fruits of the earth."

Can you think of times when something unexpected in your life has seemingly *rained on your parade*? Has this *rainy* event/time ever turned out more positively than you would have imagined when that proverbial storm cloud first materialized?

We've heard the saying that challenges are what make us stronger and that God never gives us problems that we can't get through without His help. Do we believe this? Do we live our lives in this fashion? How do we react when tough times confront us? I'd suggest that complaints aren't the answer, but a thankfulness for what we have and requests for help from above might be the best course. And a situation that looks *rainy* at the outset might help produce very real fruits of the spirit: patience, peace, and joy.

That said, it might help for us to use Form I for a few weeks – we sure could use some rain and seasonable weather.

I came away with several impressions: first, I'm glad I went for several reasons. Time spent with our youth was invaluable, especially Wednesday evening's church service. I also got to see how YouthWorks!, with whom we've "done" mission trips for several years, does it. I'm not sure we will continue to partner with them, based on concerns I have. We will evaluate our options in the months ahead. The youth have been wanting an international trip, and Adriane has said that next year's trip will be to Puerto Rico (yes, I know that's the U.S., not international!), but that's not an absolute set-in-stone choice. We may be doing something entirely different in the summer of 2011. Stay tuned for further developments!

Finally, let me give you the September worship schedule: Sunday, September 5 is the Sunday of Labor Day weekend and, as is customary, there will be one Service at 10 am. Normally, that would be the last of the single Service Sundays, but Restoration Sunday is September 19 and there is only one Service then. The Bishop's annual visitation is September 26 and there is only one Service then. So the whole month of September will be single Service Sundays: 10 am on September 5 and 12, 11 am on September 19 and 26. Then, it will be back to 9 and 11 am services in October. I hope this isn't too confusing! We look forward to having everyone back from the summer *diaspora*. St. Peter's isn't the same without you.




